


Technology Tip

Quick Tips for Teachers in TIENET

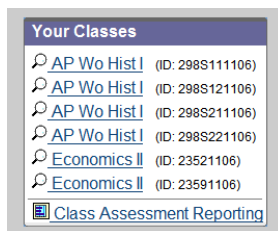
In this tech tip, we'll step through some of the common uses of TIENET for the classroom teacher.

- **Login:** You can login to TIENET from any of the school websites or directly at www.tienet.ws. The School/District ID is Barrington and you should already have your unique user id and password.

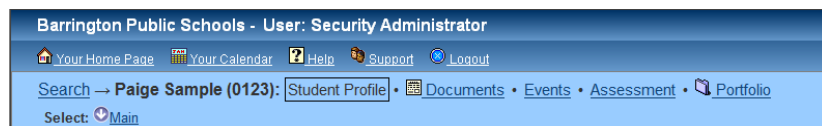

- **Accessing Rosters:** When you login to TIENET your rosters should appear on your home page. Access the roster by clicking on the hyperlink or magnifying glass:

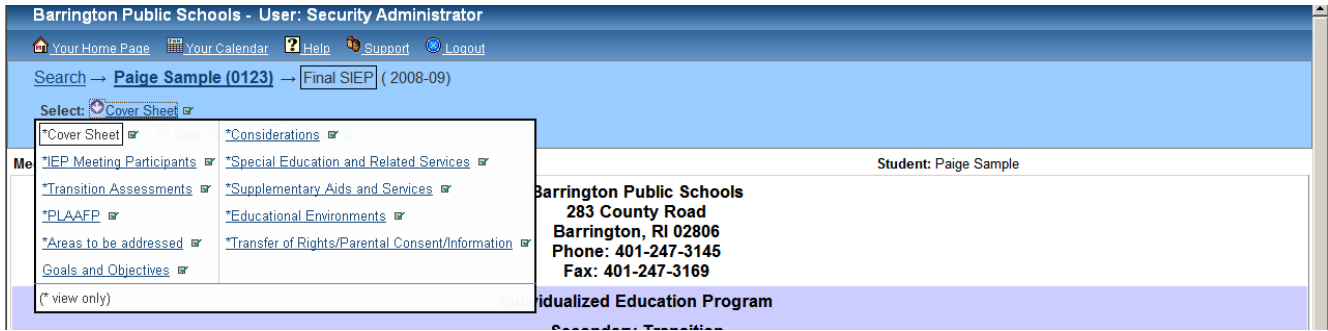


- **Accessing Student Documents (IEP, PLP, 504...):** Select a student by clicking on the down arrow next to the student name and selecting profile or documents. Either option will get you to the associated documents but if you select profile, you will also have access to additional student information and student assessments.

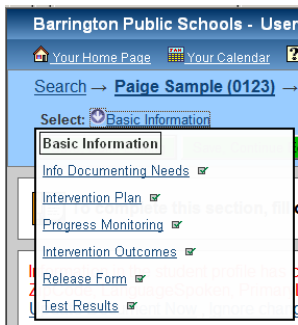


From the list of documents, select the one that you are interested in. Be careful to select the most recent document – located at the top of the list. If you feel documents are outdated, please contact the case manager or coordinator for additional information.

For the regular education teacher, the most useful page of the **IEP** will be the Special Education and Related Services page. This can be accessed by clicking the down arrow next to cover sheet and selecting the page.



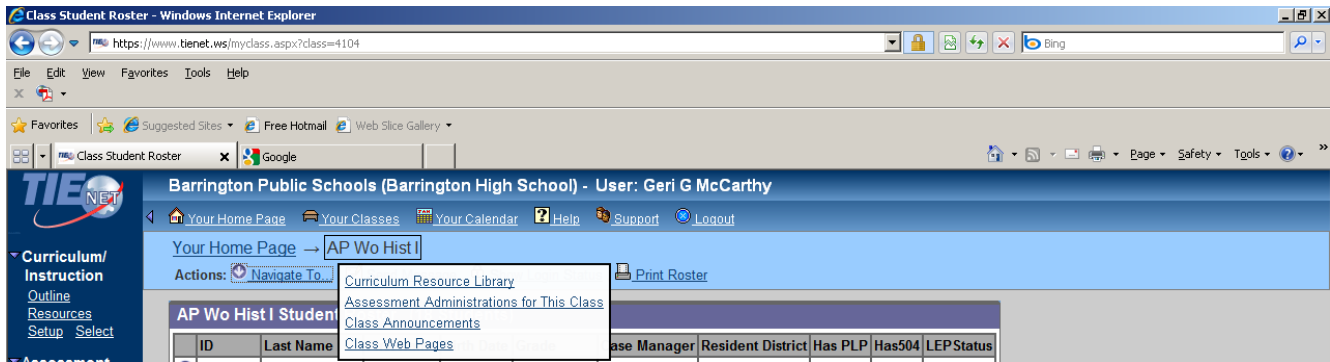
Pages of the **PLP**, accessed as identified above, are as follows:



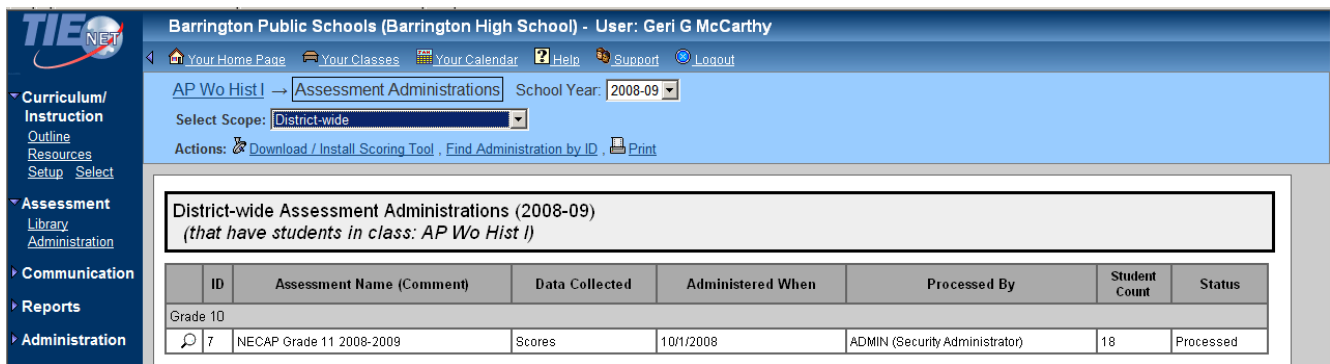
- Accessing Assessments by Individual Student:** Individual student assessment data can be accessed through the assessment link in the student profile. A sample, not identifying the associated senior, follows:

- **Accessing Assessments by class:** From the class roster, select the drop down arrow Navigate to and select Assessment Administrations for This Class



Identify the school year and type of administration, as follows for NECAP 08-09.



Click the magnifying glass to see scores for your students. Make sure that *Rubric Levels* is selected in the *Analyze* box to view by proficiency level. From this screen you can look at individual students, grouping by proficiency level, grouping by a variety of properties, or over time.
