- Enrollment
 - Class size
 - Student / Teacher Ratios
- Course Offering and Assignments
- Student Needs / Interests
- Analyze Per Pupil Expenditures by Program
- Zero Base Budget (ZBB) is a budgeting process that asks managers to build a budget from the ground up, starting from zero.

Examples of Programs Evaluated



- K-3 Instructional Coach added as a result of literacy and science needs based on state and local assessment data
- [Future ready assessment for 1:1](#) being used to evaluate implementation, develop goals, and action plan
- 6-8 Middle School Visioning Exercise emphasized need for Problem Based Learning – added a consultant to provide coaching
